The mobility transition around the world has begun. Disruptive technological trends and changing behavioural patterns have facilitated the ascent of innovative mobility solutions worldwide. Dropping battery prices power the e-mobility market. Digitalization changes everything from supply chain management to new mobility services.

What is the implication for climate change? How can government best support the transformation in a climate friendly manner? Currently, governments play a prominent role in a competitive transport market: the provision of infrastructure, the regulation of markets and the supply of transport services are key functions of transport authorities. But, are governments equipped with the necessary skills and instruments to manage the mobility transition? What can and should governments do in cooperation with the private sector, academia and civil society to enable a transformation that delivers on mobility, quality of life and the environment?

Aim of the conference is to foster dialogue and knowledge exchange among transport decision makers from all over the world on the future role and the potential of governments in transforming mobility with an emphasis on innovations, that are not only disruptive, but effectively contribute to a climate friendly transport sector.

During the conference, about 90 representatives mainly from transport ministries, transport institutions and cities from about 15 countries exchange with another 60 German and international experts from politics, business, think tanks and academia.

The conference is part of the Changing Transport Week from 24 to 28 September 2018 in Berlin and participation by invitation only.
