# Join THE global dialogue on changing transport, boost your knowledge and gain new impulses for cooperation

This year will mark the sixth Transport and Climate Change Week and we are very much looking forward to continuing the discussion. In addition to providing a forum for recognising past achievements, the upcoming event will facilitate and strengthen ties in the global transport community while also highlighting opportunities for moving forward in sustainable transport. To facilitate peer learning beyond the scope of individual projects, the 2023 edition will be hosted solely as a face-to-face event in Berlin, Germany.

As in the past, the event will bring together practitioners from countries; will provide 1.5 days of in-depth training, not panel discussions; and will enable peer learning and the sharing of country experiences, without a focus on expert input.



## Take part in a wide-ranging programme and become part of a global network

The Transport and Climate Change Week 2023 will consist of **four days of in-the-room programme** with ~ 120 in person participants from partner countries, no streaming and no online participation is possible or foreseen.

We offer training courses on a variety of topics. Participants are counterparts from GIZ projects. On Wednesday opens the week to a wider audience with the **Symposium - A glimpse into the future**. The German and global transport community is then invited to join the debate with practitioners from around the world and discuss how to achieve net-zero climate goals in the transport sector. Later in the day, the German Federal Ministry of Economic Affairs and Climate Action and the IKI Secretariat will host the International Climate Initiative's Transport Implementer Exchange. We continue with dedicated learning and inspiring concrete actions and **building global and regional networks** that will continue after the conference.

In addition, **field-visits** will provide opportunities to learn about local experiences and solutions.

Our specific aims for 2023 Transport and Climate Change Week are to:

- Visualise achievements, stories of change, lessons learned and innovation in our partner countries.
- Equip participants for future action through in-depth thematic training, while maintaining the flagship character of the event as a forum for peer-to-peer exchange.
- **Target** our efforts towards the ambitious goal of net zero in the transport sector.
- Deliver ideas through a global network of transport experts and practitioners.

Each day of the week will be generally dedicated to a different topic, with activities that flow from these objectives



## The narrative and key elements

#### Visualise achievements

#### Monday we will VISUALISE

achievements, stories of change, lessons learned, and challenges still faced in our partner countries. The goal of this day is to celebrate all the work done to foster a transition to sustainable transport.

After lunch, we will proceed to the heart of this year's event: to **EQUIP** ourselves for achieving the ambitious target of a net-zero transport sector. The aim of second part of the day and Tuesday is to further develop our knowledge and expertise while engaging with content developed by experts in sustainable transport.

#### Equipping ourselves for success

**Tuesday** will continue the **EQUIP** training sessions. In addition, countries that have built capacity in any format will have an opportunity to showcase their activities (institutional innovation, policy instruments, team capacity building, MRV systems, etc.).

These three half-day sessions will boost our capacity to increase ambition, accelerate policy action, and implement effective solutions.

#### The training topics are:

- 1. Policy design for vehicle efficiency
- 2. Best practice policies and regulations for electric mobility
- 3. Implementing low carbon and inclusive urban mobility
- 4. Finance & business models for sustainable transport
- 5. PtX transport training (with a focus on maritime shipping)

#### Symposium A glimpse into the future

Wednesday is our Symposium day. The German and global transport community will join the debate and discuss how to achieve net-zero climate goals in the transport sector. The overarching aim is to **TARGET** not just emissions reductions, but rather the achievement of net-zero emissions in the transport sector. . With leaders, decision makers, and experts in the room, we will create a space for discussing strategies and solutions and identifying potential synergies.




