The 2024 edition will be the seventh Transport and Climate Change Week (Transport Week) and will be entirely virtual, allowing a wider audience to participate.

By **#ConnectingtheDots**, we are creating an environment for integrated solutions, ensuring a global perspective and fostering global transport action.

As in the past, during the week of 4-8 November, the event will bring together practitioners from countries, provide a live virtual space for regional and global exchanges, and host partners' side events. It will enable peer learning and the sharing of country experiences, as well as expert input to integrate and promote a holistic approach.

Our specific aims for #TransportWeek24 are to:

- **Spot the dots** of regional achievements, stories of change, lessons learned and innovations in our partner countries, and the global transport community.
- **Connect solutions** from local actions to the global level; expert and empirical experiences; innovation and technology; transport with other sectors.
- **Integrate approaches** to improve solutions through lessons learned building long-term strategies towards net zero in the transport sector.
- **Activate transformation** by promoting a joint message that strengthens commitment and a global network for sustainable transport.

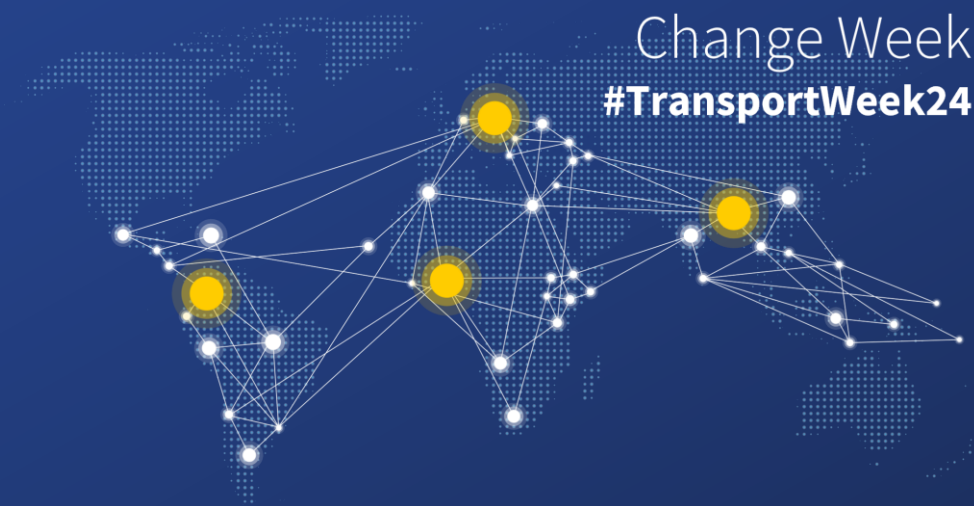
As every year, the heart of the conference is to promote peer exchange. The 2024 programme includes dedicated sessions for each region.

Through the exchanging between projects in our partner countries, we aim to **spot the regional perspectives**.

We will go deeper into the relevant topics by creating spaces for side-events that will **connect and integrate experiences and solutions** through dialogues between experts and practitioners.

Our commitment is to **activate transformation**. This year we will promote a joint message to be shared at the 2024 UN Climate Change Conference (UNFCCC COP 29).

We will continue to strengthen the leadership and international reach of country leaders.

Global Community

Every year we look forward to an inspiring opening and a "Conference Day". This year we expect to launch a joint message to be carried to UNFCCC COP 29 in Baku.



Regional Perspectives

The heart of Transport Week is to connect peers to learn from each other. Regional Perspectives is a dedicated exchange for projects in the same region.



Projects Practices

In order to exchange across borders between projects, we have dedicated sessions to learning from reality and sharing reflections with peer countries and experts.



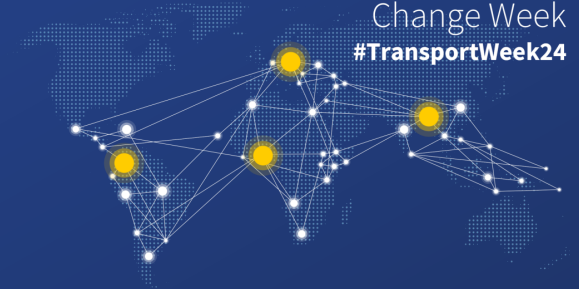
Side Events

To deepen our conversation, we have dedicated spaces to highlight a relevant topic, bringing together external experts with partners in countries.



What to expect?

Transport Week is a time when we all come together to bring to the global table experiences, lessons learned, solutions and open questions. This year will be dedicated to **spot** achievements, **connecting** solutions, integrating **approaches**, and calling for **action**, with activities stemming from these objectives.



Invitation to Act

On **Monday** 4 November, #TransportWeek24 will kick off with an official welcome from the authorities, followed by a keynote speech. We will have an honest conversation about political leadership and adaptive change.

Multisectoral Urban Mobility

Tuesday 5 November will be dedicated to multisectoral cooperation and gender transformative systems to achieve affordable and sustainable urban mobility. The second day will be dedicated to learning from the regional experiences in the **Western Balkans**.

Standards & Innovation

On **Wednesday**, the regional perspective from **Africa** will provide benchmarking with proven solutions and an invitation not to reinvent the wheel. We will address adaptation in transport. As part of the day, we will open up to the wider ecosystem conversing about fuel roadmaps. We will close knowing the regional perspective from **Latin America**.

The Climate Commitment

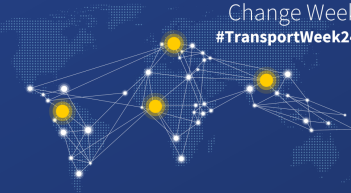
Thursday will be our Conference Day, time for climate commitment. This year, the regional **Asian** perspective will invite us to achieve the NDC targets. Standards in transition with a truck decarbonisation perspective and a vehicle efficiency analysis. The peak of the week will be a message for future transport climate action to be delivered to the UNFCCC COP 29 in Baku.

Tracking Change

On **Friday**, the week will conclude with a discussion on tools for tracking change and the role of think tanks. As farewell of the week, we will share the concept for Transport and Climate Change Week 2025, the 8th edition of which will be hosted in person in Berlin.
